
Dear Friend,




Now Abigail is a thriving second grader who is looking forward to returning to school where her favorite subjects are reading and math.



I'm happy to report that Abigail will not be struggling in school this year! Here at Arms of Hope with her mother Erika, she's doing great!

Abigail has a bright, bubbly personality. She loves math and reading and enjoys playing with her friends. Of course, like many girls her age, she adores cheerleading and gymnastics.

She also loves her Bible class. I believe it helps children so much when they learn that God loves them and has a plan for them!

Abigail says "Thank you for my many blessings." She's so grateful to you for all the kindness you've shared. Her mother Erika, who is completing her education so that she can provide for her family one day soon, shares Abigail's heartfelt gratitude as well.

I know there are still other children who need our help. Our phone rings

almost every day and, although I don't want to think of children like Abigail spending even one night out on the street, we can't help them unless good folks like you help us.
